Call to Worship - Isaiah 9:2, 6-7

In this season of Advent, one of my favorite reminders is of the Incarnation - the nearness of Jesus. Immanuel, God With Us. The creator of the world, triune God, sends his Son to be fully man and fully God and walk among people He came to redeem.

This world can be so overwhelming at times, with trials and brokenness and sin. If this week has knocked you off your feet or if you are resting in a season of peace, praise the Lord that he is with us no matter our circumstances. He drew near to people through the birth of Jesus Christ, Immanuel, and praise the Lord that He draws near to us this morning as we gather together.

Read the underlined portions with me of a prophecy from Isaiah about God coming down to us:

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder. and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end. on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this. Isaiah 9:2, 6-7 ESV
