0:00 Call to Worship - Exodus 34:5-7; Psalm 145:8-9, 21

Today is the fourth Sunday of Advent—we're only a week away from Christmas! Today's Advent candle symbolizes God's love demonstrated to us in the birth of Christ. And that love has always been God's heart toward his people. Listen to God describing himself to Moses:

5 The Lord came down in a cloud, stood with him there, and proclaimed his name, "the Lord."

6 The Lord passed in front of him and proclaimed:

The Lord—the Lord is a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger and abounding in faithful love and truth, 7 maintaining faithful love to a thousand generations, forgiving iniquity, rebellion, and sin.

Exodus 34:5-7a, CSB

Moses's response to God was to fall down and worship. Let's posture our hearts to do the same this morning. Read this aloud with me:

**8 The Lord is gracious and merciful,
slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

9 The Lord is good to all,
and his mercy is over all that he has made.

21 My mouth will speak the praise of the Lord,
and let all flesh bless his holy name forever and ever.**

Psalm 145:8-9, 21

Church, God is steadfast to us, but we can't always say the same for ourselves. We ignore him, fight him, outright tell him that what he wants in our lives doesn't matter. Our disappointment pushes God from his rightful place and separates us from him, hardening us to his grace.

But God has made a way for us to be brought near: through Jesus Christ, who was born to redeem us. And this was God's plan from the beginning: to call his people back to himself. God speaks this through the prophet Joel:

12 That is why the Lord says,
"Turn to me now, while there is time.
Give me your hearts.
Come with fasting, weeping, and mourning.
13 Don't tear your clothing in your grief,
but tear your hearts instead."
Return to the Lord your God,
for he is merciful and compassionate,
slow to get angry and filled with unfailing love.
He is eager to relent and not punish.
Joel 2:12-13, NLT

December is a month that goes nonstop. But if you were to pause, be still, what would come to the surface? Would your heart need to be torn back into feeling? Would it need to be mended from too much?

Right now, I invite you to take a moment of stillness to return to the Lord.

0:00 Baptism
