Luke: Upside Down (2024)

Call to Worship John 1:1-5

Good morning, let's hear a word from John chapter 1: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it."

Jesus knows better than any person who ever lived, what true worship looks like, feels like, and sounds like. Because he was there in the beginning when God and humans walked together daily in the garden. So this morning as we sing to Jesus and later hear His words preached, let us remember that he is the ultimately authority on worship since the beginning of creation. He is simultaneously the most deserving of it, and the most faithful to practice it.

So let's lift as our voices as we worship the one who is worthy of all our praise.

There is A Peace

Confession - Psalm 63:1-4

Oftentimes when we read Bible stories, we put ourselves in the shoes of the hero. Let's be honest, we would all much rather see ourselves in David the unlikely victor than Goliath the evil Philistine, or in Stephen the faithful martyr rather than the misguided Sanhedrin who chose violence over repentance. It's natural for us to read ourselves into stories as the character who has the fewest lessons to learn.

But let's consider a different perspective. What if instead of the victorious hero, you were the one who was so confident in their own strength and abilities that you rarely considered your need for a Savior. Or what if instead of the faithful martyr, you were the one who plugged your ears and turned your face when your choices were called into question by someone who cared about you.

Take a moment and ask yourself this question: what might I learn if I consider that my sin holds the same weight as those I judge the most in Scripture?

This is not a call to hate on yourself or to call your faith into doubt. It's a reminder that our daily worship and repentance before God is both a reflection of our capacity for a faith like David and Stephen's, and our desperate need of saving like Goliath and the Sandhedrin.

Let's read together from Psalm 63:

O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you;

my soul thirsts for you;

my flesh faints for you,

as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.

2 So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary,

beholding your power and glory.

3 Because your steadfast love is better than life,

my lips will praise you.

4 So I will bless you as long as I live;

in your name I will lift up my hands.
