I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I myself will make them lie down, declares the Lord God. I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, and the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them in justice.

Ezekiel 34:15-16

Confession - Matthew 26:31

Jesus, the good shepherd, knew that all of the disciples would turn away from him as he laid down his life for them - as he and the disciples retreat to the Mount of Olives, Jesus tells them: "You will all fall away because of me this night. For it is written, 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered." Matthew 26:31

He knows Simon Peter will curse his name and that all of his closest friends will deny they ever knew him. How often is this you and I? We become so enamored with the frills and sparkle of worldly affections that we are quick to turn from Jesus. We sheep run full force out of the corral and straight into bushes full of thorns.

Will you pray this with me?

Lord Jesus, forgive us. We deny you and run from you. You, who are the best portion, who loves us most deeply, even to your death on the cross. Help us to run to you instead of running away when we are scared and guilty. Restore us, oh Lord!

When Jesus told Peter he'd deny Him, that is not where Jesus left the conversation. Jesus told Peter, "I have pleaded in prayer for you, Simon, that your faith should not fail. So when you have repented and turned to me again, strengthen your brothers." (Luke 22:32), NLT. Not if, when. He waits for us to turn back. He prays for us.
