0:00 Call to Worship - Psalm 115:1-3, 16-18

Here's a good question for us to consider at the beginning of a gathering like this: why do we sing together? Because it sounds nice? Because it makes us feel good? Well, depending on who's sitting next to you, it might not sound nice (haha). And depending on the day, you may not feel like singing at all. So why do we do it? We can answer simply, because we're giving glory. We are singing not to ourselves, but to the God who chose to create us out of nothing. Listen to these words from Psalm 115 (and if you're willing, speak the underlined parts out loud):

Not to us, O Lord, not to us, but to your name give glory, for the sake of your steadfast love and your faithfulness!

Why should the nations say,

"Where is their God?"

16 The heavens are the Lord's heavens, but the earth he has given to the children of man.

17 The dead do not praise the Lord, nor do any who go down into silence.

0:00 Confession - Jeremiah 9:23-24

When God created us, he crowned us with his image. This is a beautiful reality for every person on the planet. But it is also a crown that every person on the planet twists. And instead of admiring the God who chose to create us for his glory, we admire ourselves and our own glory. But—

23 Thus says the Lord: "Let not the wise man boast in his wisdom, let not the mighty man boast in his might, let not the rich man boast in his riches, 24 but let him who boasts boast in this, that he understands and knows me, that I am the Lord who practices steadfast love, justice, and righteousness in the earth. For in these things I delight, declares the Lord." Jeremiah 9:23-24
