### 0:00 Call to Worship

Because Jesus Christ has conquered death and shared his power and strength with his people, the beginning of a gathering like this is always a call to worship. It's a call to hear the mighty voice from heaven that so many ignore and to respond with songs of praise. So this morning I'm going to read at length from Psalm 68 while the music plays. I invite you to close your eyes and focus on hearing the word of the Lord about his conquering King:

Read Psalm 68:1-10, 17-21

Now let's finish the psalm and respond with the underlined portion:

32 O kingdoms of the earth, sing to God;

sing praises to the Lord, Selah

to him who rides in the heavens, the ancient heavens;

behold, he sends out his voice, his mighty voice.

34 Ascribe power to God,

whose majesty is over Israel,

and whose power is in the skies.

Congregation:

35 Awesome is God from his sanctuary;

the God of Israel—he is the one who gives power and strength to his people. Blessed be God! Psalm 68:32-35

#### 0:00 Confession

Before he departed Jesus said to his disciples and ultimately to us,

33 Little children...Where I am going you cannot come. 34 Å new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. 35 By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13:33-35

In just a moment we'll be singing these lyrics together:

"In the longing of our souls

In the darkness where we go

You are there

You are love

You are altogether good

In the weakness of our faith

In the silence where we wait

You are here

You're enough

You are altogether good"

Church, for now, Jesus is not physically present with us. So in our longing and our darkness, in our weakness and in God's silence, how do we know he is there, and he is love, and he is altogether good? The answer is, when we love each other. Let's take a moment before we sing, and acknowledge our need for the body of Christ to be the hands and feet of Jesus to us.

And as we sing, let's sing with the body of Christ in mind, and how it is a gift from the One who is altogether good.
