Call to Worship - Genesis 3:15

God always cares for his people. From the beginning, he created humanity in a beautiful garden, filled with life and food, with a command to rule over it. There he gave man and woman the gift of marriage, and together they walked with God each day. Even when they disobeyed God's direct command, he made a way for them to be saved through the promise of a coming Savior. He spoke to the serpent who deceived the woman,

I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel. Genesis 3:15

That promised offspring of the woman would one day be bruised upon the cross. But in so doing, he would actually be crushing the head of the serpent. Let's declare this truth together:

Jesus Christ has defeated the power of Satan, sin, and death!

So this morning, even though we come still facing the hardships of a fallen world, God is caring for us. He has walked with us each day this week, and he calls us to worship him together. Let us praise him!

Praise Him Praise Him (Lifeway)

Confession - 2 Timothy 2:11-13

It's easy for us to shake our heads at the Israelites in the book of Exodus. Their complaining and fear and doubt can give us a kind of superiority complex. Yet, how often do we have a similar attitude?

In Detrich Bonhoeffer's book Life Together, he quotes Martin Luther saying,

"The Kingdom is to be in the midst of your enemies. And he who will not suffer this does not want to be of the Kingdom of Christ; he wants to be among friends, to sit among roses and lilies, not with the bad people but the devout people... If Christ had done what you are doing who would ever have been spared?"

Let's take a moment to consider this question and confess our need for God together:

Where in your life are you choosing ease over the hardships of following Christ?

Now let's find hope and strength in this prayer from 2 Timothy 2:

If we die with him, we'll live with him; If we stick it out with him, we'll rule with him; If we turn our backs on him, he'll turn his back on us;

If we give up on him, he does not give up-

for there's no way he can be false to himself.
