Exodus: Wooed in the Wilderness

Call to Worship - 1 John 3:1

Happy Father's Day! This is a special day because—no matter if you are a father or not—we have all been impacted by biological and spiritual fathers in our lives. They are a living picture of the strength, protection, and leadership of God.

To the fathers in our midst—we give thanks for you today! You are gifts from God. Your impact is immeasurable.

We also want to acknowledge that this can be a difficult day for some of us. It can be a reminder of childlessness, singleness, neglect, abuse, broken relationships, empty nests, and fathers who have passed. These things are worthy of lament, and God the Father enters the sorrow with us.

Whether you find yourself celebrating, grieving, or both, let's join together in this moment to rejoice in our heavenly Father. Hear these words from 1 John 3:1 and say the underlined portion with me:

See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!

And that is what we are!

Confession - Nehemiah 9:9, 16-21, 31

Even though we have the title and privileges of being God's children, if we are honest, we spend a lot of time struggling to live that way.

We stiffen our necks to his commandments.

We doubt his faithful love.

We despair that we are really his beloved sons and daughters.

We forget that we were made to worship him and him alone.

But thanks be to God, he does not forsake his children in the wilderness.

Let these words from Nehemiah 9 encourage you. Read the underlined portion with me.

You saw the affliction of our fathers in Egypt and heard their cry... But they and our fathers acted presumptuously and stiffened their neck and did not obey your commandments. They refused to obey and were not mindful of the wonders that you performed among them, but they stiffened their neck and appointed a leader to return to their slavery in Egypt.

But you are a God ready to forgive, gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and did not forsake them.

Even when they had made for themselves a golden calf and said, 'This is your God who brought you up out of Egypt', and had committed great blasphemies,

you in your great mercies did not forsake them in the wilderness.

The pillar of cloud to lead them in the way did not depart from them by day, nor the pillar of fire by night to light for them the way by which they should go. You gave your good Spirit to instruct them and did not withhold your manna from their mouth and gave them water for their thirst. Forty years you sustained them in the wilderness, and they lacked nothing. Their clothes did not wear out and their feet did not swell.

In your great mercies you did not make an end of them or forsake them, for you are a gracious and merciful God. Nehemiah, 9:9, 16-21, 31
