Good Morning and welcome to Antioch Church! Happy Mother's Day! In mothers, we see the image of God. And not only that. In mothers, we see the promise of God—that he would crush the head of the serpent, Satan, through the woman's offspring, Jesus Christ. For these reasons and many more, motherhood is worthy of praise. Let's give God thanks for these wonderful gifts!

If you're a mother here today, whether biologically or spiritually, we thank the Lord for you! Today we remember your authentic faith, which is passed on from generation to generation. Help us rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.

Continue to raise up in our midst biological and spiritual mothers

That we may all grow into the fullness of Christ.

**Death is swallowed up in victory.

O death, where is your victory?

O death, where is your sting?**

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.

But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, my beloved brothers, and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain. Amen.
