For everyone, here are a few ways to take the following steps:

1) Food Pantry is next Saturday, November 18th. Although the doors technically don't open until 10:00am, the line begins forming at 8:00am. It seems heartless to let our visitors stand out in the cold, not to mention registration becomes a huge bottleneck if we wait until 10:00 to open the doors. Last month, we had around 40 families signed in before 10:00. With that in mind, we want to strongly encourage, beseech, exhort, and plead with servants to arrive by 9:00am on Saturday.

Box prep will be this Friday, November 17th at 9:00am. Earlier this year, our goal was to pack 35-40 boxes on box prep days. This Friday, we are hoping to pack 85 food boxes and 85 bags of produce.

Please consider serving on Friday and/or Saturday. Both days are 100% kid-friendly and you're guaranteed to have a good time. We also have additional ongoing needs for sturdy, medium-sized boxes and for folks to help with weekday Dare to Care food pickups. Food pickups can take place anytime Monday-Friday between 7:30am and 12:30pm, which is perfect for Boyce or Southern students, retirees, independently wealthy folks, and so on - basically anyone who doesn't have a 9-5 job. 2) Operation Christmas Child boxes are due back today so make sure you leave them on the table before you leave.

3) For parents of Young Disciples, next Sunday, November 19th will be the last Young Disciples class of the year. Parents: note that we will have donuts for the class on that day. There will be no Young Disciples the Sunday after Thanksgiving and no Young Disciples during Advent. Classes will resume in January.

4) We are in need of at least two people to run slides. We will train you. It is a very simple way to serve, but does require commitment.

We begin each gathering with a call to worship and end with a benediction, which is simply a reminder that we are blessed to be a blessing.
